Doris Day

Day is a clinical associate professor of dermatology at New York University Langone Medical Center and the author of Forget the Facelift (Avery/Penguin USA).

What do you love about working on "The Big Breakthroughs"?

"I want to spread the word about products that stand out and step up. And I think it's really important to participate in the process, because as a dermatologist, I can reach one person at a time, but Allure can reach millions."

Which product excites you most this year?

"Living Proof Neotensil is a concept we haven't had before. It takes us into a new age in terms of nonsurgical, temporary improvements for undereye bags. It's not perfect, but it has good science behind it, and it's a first in its class and will keep getting better and better."



Jeannette Graf

Graf is a dermatologist and assistant clinical professor of dermatology at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City.

What is this year's most exciting breakthrough?

"Avène XeraCalm A.D.
It comes in a cleansing oil,
a cream, and a balm
that all contain a specific
microorganism that plays
a pivotal part in anti-itch
and skin calming. It also
had the longest clinical
study. The discovery of
that microorganism led to
12 years of research
and development, the same
time usually devoted
to developing a drug."

What was the most challenging part of the process?

"There were plenty of late nights and early mornings.

To stay sharp, I made sure to have extra helpings of the green drink I make by mixing powdered greens with spring water. I also did my best to stick to my exercise routine. It helped me power through."



Ranella Hirsch

Hirsch is a dermatologist in Boston.

What is your top beauty breakthrough of all time?

"The understanding of how lasers could be safely utilized to treat a plethora of skin concerns hair, aging, acne, and an ever-growing list."

What about just this year—what is the most exciting breakthrough?

"More than any
one product, it's how the
category of skin care
continues to evolve, with
products to target not
just specific problems but
their root causes."

When did you find the time to review all the product research we sent?

"I kept up on reading clinicals as they came in, between patient cases, due-diligence meetings, and whenever my little ones napped!"



Heidi Waldorf

Waldorf is a dermatologist and the director of laser and cosmetic dermatology at Mount Sinai Medical Center.

How did you find the time to wade through all the research that Allure sent to you?

"I did it early in the morning and late at night.

I could also get reading done at airports and on international and long-haul flights—that's my quiet time when no one can reach me."

What do you think is the top beauty breakthrough of all time?

"Restylane was the first long-lasting hyaluronic acid filler approved in the U.S. It allows us to replenish volume rather than just fill lines, and the improvement can be built upon over time rather than it being gone in a few months."

Anti-Ager

DISCOLORATION. Every lightener takes
